## artistic director

This festival grew out of a desire to create something that would honour the artists in Thunder Bay and bring artists together from across the country. While spending my summer in Thunder Bay two years ago I contacted Paul Burke from the city about using park space for this project and he suggested that I look at the Spirit Garden. I was immediately captivated by its natural beauty and possibility. I love outdoor theatre because of the unpredictable nature of it and the possibility for a magical experience in a natural setting. What was to be a one or two show event, slowly turned into a festival with artists from other disciplines, in other venues in the city and a team of dedicated artists and supporters of the arts. This is due to the initial funding from the Ontario Arts Council and the Department of Canadian Heritage. We then began reaching out to our own community and found the necessary support that allowed us to move forward. We could not have done it without our sponsors - thank you for believing in this festival.

This year marks a beginning. An opportunity. It's our launch year and that means you are with us to celebrate the potential for our future.

We want to hear from you - what did you love? What do you want to see next year? What does community mean to you and how do we take part in building it? Night Wings centres around a 12 year old girl named Molly. The year is 1938 and Molly's world includes her brother Jari and her nearby grandfather, "Ukki". The family is under strain, not only because the father works out in the timber camps for weeks at a time but Molly has additional challenges due to the fact that she has vision loss. Jari's response is to become overly protective of his sister while Molly finds independence through an imaginary world of her own making. When Jari finds a wounded owl and decides to secretively nurse it back to health, a series of events unfold that puts both the children at risk.

### director's note

Night Wings is a gift. Producing a new play is no easy task but it is easier with the most generous collaborators and from the beginning it has been a joy to work on this play. The desire to open the festival with a story set in Northwestern Ontario was always important to me but to find a play that is rooted in this place with so much heart and magic is a gift from Eleanor.

The connection to nature and the realization of ones own mortality is something that everyone can connect to. Superior Theatre Festival has been given the opportunity to bring this play to life. I hope you enjoy it and I hope you go away thinking about your own family, your roots and your responsibility to each other.

### playwright's note

So many influences and ideas are woven together in a creative project and sometimes it's difficult to pinpoint the exact moment when a story begins to take shape. I've always felt a deep connection with birds, and perhaps *Night Wings* was brewing inside me since I was a child. However, the first draft appeared not long after my father passed away and perhaps it was my way of keeping him close to me. Many people contributed to the the play's development, from bird banders to people in the Finnish community of Thunder Bay, including Finn

Thunder 2012. Also Theatre Direct, Ottawa Little Theatre, Carousel Players, dramaturgs Lila Cano and Iris Turcott were all involved at some point along the way. Without their support and the support of Superior Theatre Festival, this play would remain on the page. Thank you to all who've contributed their time and talent over the years.

Moez Surani is a poet whose writing has been published internationally, including in Harper's Magazine, The Walrus, Best Canadian Poetry 2013 and Best Canadian Poetry 2014. He has attended artists' residencies in Finland, Italy, Switzerland and Taiwan, and among the awards his work has won is the Chalmers Arts Fellowship, which supported a research stint to India and East Africa. When his first collection of poetry, *Reticent Bodies*, was published, one critic assessed the book's impact: "Reticent Bodies is that rare book that has the power to be a lynchpin, a hinge in the history of Canadian poetry."

In 2012, Surani published a second collection, *Floating Life*, which was described as suffused with "stunning, simple images." Recently, he has been working on collaborations and on interdisciplinary art and performance art pieces.

# NIGHT WINGS COMMUNITY ART-MAKING PROJECT

Art has the ability to merge disciplines in an interesting, accessible and transformative way. The community art-making project at the Baggage Building will be complimentary and intertwined with STF's presentation of "Night Wings" at the Spirit Garden. Through collaborative efforts, an art piece will be created to serve as a "legacy" of the first year of the festival.

The art-making will focus on the bird themes; the great grey owl, the nuthatch, grosbeak and wren to create a "universal" bird. Using a large metal armature of a flying bird as the foundation, participants can cut strips of fabric and tie them on the armature or onto other strips of fabric. As time passes, the bird will gain wholeness and finally, at completion, be able to fly. Participants may also make bracelets out of fabric and beads as a take-home.

Betty is a multi-disciplinary artist whose practice includes writing, design, photography, drawing, film, performance and installation. She's made a sustained and visible presence particularly at the community level. She was the instructor of the Theatre in Education program at Magnus Theatre from 2002 - 2015. Prior to that she directed a 4-minute pseudomentry film, "Impersians", an exploration that incorporates the painting app, Brushes and documentary footage about Thunder Bay's iconic pastry. Betty is of Indigenous decent, from the Nelson House Cree Nation in northern Manitoba.
